Licenses or renewals may be purchased at the Village office at the following rates:

<u>Yearly Dog Licenses (per dog/year):</u>

Neutered / Spayed: \$25 Not Neutered / Spayed: \$50 Restricted breed: \$100

Fines may be issued for unlicensed dogs.

Business Licenses:

Resident rate: \$25/per year

All new businesses / home occupations must apply at the Village office for a license to operate.

Non-resident: all business or trade

\$100/ annum \$25/ week \$10/ day
