A GLANCE AT OUR PAST

This is the first of what we hope will be a recurring series of snapshots of the people and events that have shaped our wonderful Village.

In 1903, John Elder was the second homesteader to lay claim to the fertile land surrounding what is now Barnwell. By 1909, the family had a comfortable six room home in the Village proper.

Bertha, John's wife, used to put bits and pieces of poetry on her walls when they couldn't afford curtains, wallpaper, or pictures. One of her favorites was "Worthwhile" by Ella Wheeler Wilcox:

It is easy enough to be pleasant,
When life flows by like a song,
But the man worth while is one who will smile,
When everything goes dead wrong.
For the test of the heart is trouble,
And it always comes with the years,
And the smile that is worth the praises of earth,
Is the smile that shines through tears.
